<b>English</b>	<p>Spelling Focus</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Use knowledge of letter sound relationships to spell common words accurately</li></ul> <p>Reading Focus</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Use phonic and word knowledge to fluently read more complex words</li><li>• Identifies literal/implied meaning in texts</li><li>• Selects information, ideas and events that connect them with self and other texts</li></ul> <p>Writing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Correctly punctuating sentences i.e. capital letters and full stops</li><li>• Narratives/stories</li><li>• Complex text</li><li>• Persuasive text structures</li></ul>
<b>Mathematics</b>	<p>In Mathematics our students will be engaging in</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Recall multiplication facts of 2, 5, 10</li><li>• Revise 4-digit number names and numerals</li><li>• Recognise, model, represent and order numbers to at least 10 000</li><li>• Multiplication/division relationship</li><li>• Measure, order and compare objects using familiar metric units of length, mass and capacity</li><li>• Probability</li></ul>
<b>Visual Arts</b>	<p>In Visual Arts our students will explore:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Line</li><li>• Working with warm and cool colours in a variety of mediums</li></ul>
<b>Health</b>	<p>In Health this term our focus will be on personal and social skills to interact respectfully with others. Topics will include health messages, being sun smart, asking for permission, dealing with rejection and setting and respecting boundaries.</p>
<b>Physical Education</b>	<p>For the first four weeks of term, the focus will be on preparing for the Faction Athletics Carnival. Students will be given opportunities to set new PBs as well as show team-work through the team games. Selected students will then be asked to train for the Interschool Carnival in week 7. For the remainder of term, students will focus on Sofcrosse and Cricket skills. ie: throwing/catching, striking, throwing/catching with extension (sofcrosse).</p>



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<b>Music</b>	This term in Music students will continue to explore the elements of music and develop musicianship skills through songs from a variety of cultures, styles and eras; singing games; theory games; movement and dance; body percussion and playing classroom instruments, with a focus on ukulele and electronic keyboards. They will learn to identify instruments of the orchestra and instrument families.
<b>LOTE - Noongar</b>	This term in LOTE Noongar students will be learning about ocean animals <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Use familiar language and sentence patterns to share information and join conversations</li><li>• Respond to and use classroom language and instructions</li><li>• In language, label and name ocean animals</li><li>• Join in shared reading and identify key words</li><li>• Identify key features of sentence patterns (e.g. rules, word order)</li></ul>
