English	<p>In English students will be engaging in Spelling Focus</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• use knowledge of letter sound relationships to spell common words accurately <p>Reading Focus</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• use phonic and word knowledge to fluently read more complex words• identifies literal/implied meaning in texts• selects information, ideas and events that connect them with self and other texts <p>Writing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Correctly punctuating sentences, i.e. capital letters and full stops• Using a variety of sentence types.• Using paragraphs• Persuasive text structures
Mathematics	<p>Students will be engaging in strategies to learn multiplication facts such as</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Turn turnaround idea i.e. $3 \times 2 = 6$ so $3 \times 2 = 6$ and $6 \div 3 = 2$ and $6 \div 2 = 3$• Division• Factors and multiples• Subtraction – formal method• Estimating• Number patterns and rules• Fractions• Probability• Graphing
Visual Arts	<p>In Visual Arts our students will explore:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Pastels: techniques.• Line.• Working with warm and cool colours in a variety of mediums.
Health	<p>For the first part of term, we will be looking at bullying – what it looks like and the strategies that could be used to stop the situation from occurring again.</p> <p>For the remainder of term, students will explore how individuals react to different contexts and situations in a variety of ways. They will develop the knowledge, understanding and skills required to make healthy, safe and active choices.</p>
Physical Education	<p>For the first four weeks of term, the focus will be on preparing for the Faction Athletics Carnival. Students will be given opportunities to set new PBs as well as show team-work through the team games.</p> <p>Selected students will then be asked to train for the Interschool Carnival in week 7.</p> <p>For the remainder of term, students will focus on Sofcrosse and Cricket skills. ie: throwing/catching, striking, throwing/catching with extension (sofcrosse)</p>



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Music	This term in Music students will continue to explore the elements of music and develop musicianship skills through songs from a variety of cultures, styles and eras; singing games; theory games; movement and dance; body percussion and playing classroom instruments, with a focus on ukulele and electronic keyboards. They will learn to identify instruments of the orchestra and instrument families.
