English	<ul> <li>During Literacy this term, students will be engaging in:</li> <li>Explicit teaching of phonological awareness skills through Heggerty – rhyme, syllables, initial and final sounds.</li> <li>Explicit teaching of letter sounds and names through Letters &amp; Sounds and ULFI* Programmes.</li> <li>Learning experiences to develop an understanding of recount and procedural text.</li> <li>Experiences that encourage students to experiment with writing using their sound/letter knowledge.</li> <li>Explicit teaching of letter formation.</li> <li>Explicit teaching of vocabulary to build comprehension skills.</li> <li>Explicit teaching of sentence structure and consistency when applying punctuation such as capital letters, finger spaces, full stops, question marks, and exclamation marks.</li> <li>Explicit teaching of the different parts of speech, including nouns, verbs, adverbs and adjectives.</li> <li>Oral language opportunities are embedded in classroom activities and include 'show and tell' opportunities throughout the term.</li> <li>*Note: UFLI – University of Florida Literacy Institute program - an explicit and systematic program that teaches students the foundational skills necessary for proficient reading.</li> </ul>
Mathematics	<ul> <li>During Numeracy this term, students will be engaging in:</li> <li>Recognising, modelling, reading, writing and ordering numbers to at least 100 and locating these numbers on a number line.</li> <li>Number sequences to and from 100 by ones from any starting point.</li> <li>Skip counting by twos, fives and tens (starting from zero).</li> <li>Identifying and classifying two-dimensional shapes and three-dimensional objects according to their features.</li> <li>Telling time to the half-hour.</li> <li>Describing duration using months, weeks, days and hours.</li> <li>Give and follow directions to familiar locations.</li> <li>Measure and compare the lengths and capacities of pairs of objects using uniform informal units.</li> <li>Recognise and describe one-half as one of two equal parts of a whole.</li> </ul>
Visual Arts	<ul> <li>During Visual Arts this term, students will be engaging in:</li> <li>Exploring the enchanting world of "Under the Sea" as we delve into ocean-themed art. This theme has been specially selected in alignment with our school's exciting opportunity to showcase a selection of student artworks at the Albany Entertainment Centre for the upcoming Albany Children's Theatre production of The Little Mermaid.</li> <li>Experimenting with simple shapes, patterns, and colours to craft cheerful underwater creatures using mixed media, including crayon resist and watercolours.</li> <li>Refining and applying visual arts techniques using shape, line, and colour to convey ideas.</li> </ul>



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Physical Education	<ul> <li>During Physical Education this term, students will be engaging in:</li> <li>The skipping continuum and learning the fundamental movement skill that involves rhythmic movement.</li> <li>Hockey skills will be supported by a hockey development officer.</li> <li>Initial skill training and practice of individual events and team games for the Athletics carnival in Term 4.</li> </ul>
Health	<ul> <li>During Health &amp; Physical Education this term, students will be engaged in:</li> <li>Continuing with - Healthy and active communities - focusing on "ways health messages are communicated in the media."</li> <li>Moving onto - Personal identity and change - focusing on "Changes to the body, visible and private, as individuals grow older."</li> </ul>
Music	<ul> <li>During Music this term, students will be engaged in:</li> <li>Developing aural skills and musicianship through chants, songs, fingerplays and rhymes; games; movement and dance; and listening activities.</li> <li>Developing their understanding of rhythmic notation.</li> </ul>
LOTE - Noongar	<ul> <li>During Noongar this term, students will be engaged in:</li> <li>Explore and identify a variety of insects in the Noongar language.</li> <li>Develop skills in using the correct word order in Noongar sentences.</li> <li>Build on previously learned suffixes to form more complex sentences.</li> <li>Learn new vocabulary to enhance everyday conversation in Noongar.</li> <li>Discover the uses of traditional Noongar plants from our Six Seasons Garden, including how they were used for food, medicine, and tools.</li> </ul>
