English	During Literacy this term, students will be engaging in: • Developing their comprehension skills by identifying literal and implied meanings, main ideas, and supporting details in a text. • Daily Fluency Reading. • Focusing on alternative spellings for phonemes, applying these to their reading and writing. • Manipulating complex sounds, blending and segmenting. • Creating texts, drawing on own experiences, imagination and information learnt for different purposes and audiences. • Consolidating their understanding of simple and compound sentences. • Exploring the four different types of sentences and applying these to their writing. • Identifying and practising using nouns, proper nouns, verbs, and adjectives. • Learning to use commas to separate items in a list. • Creating, rehearsing and delivering short verbal presentations.
Mathematics	During Numeracy this term, students will be engaging in: • Continuing to count both to and from 1000. • Reading, modelling, and ordering three-digit numbers. • applying both mental and written strategies to solve addition and subtraction problems. • Using related addition and subtraction strategies. • Using the bridge to ten and jump/split strategy. • Identifying number patterns involving twos, threes, and fives. • Representing multiplication and division by organising equal-sized groups. • Revisiting/reteaching time concepts of o'clock, half past, quarter to and quarter past as well as calendars/seasons. • Comparing and ordering several shapes and objects based on length, area, volume and capacity using appropriate uniform informal units. • Comparing and ordering several shapes and objects based on length, area, volume and capacity.
Visual Arts	During Visual Arts this term, students will be engaging in: • Exploring the enchanting world of "Under the Sea" as we delve into ocean-themed art. This theme has been specially selected in alignment with our school's exciting opportunity to showcase a selection of student artworks at the Albany Entertainment Centre for the upcoming Albany Children's Theatre production of The Little Mermaid. • Experimenting with simple shapes, patterns, and colours to craft cheerful underwater creatures using mixed media, including crayon resist and watercolours. • Refining and applying visual arts techniques using shape, line, and colour to convey ideas.



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Physical Education	During Physical Education this term, students will be engaging in: • The skipping continuum and learning the fundamental movement skill that involves rhythmic movement. • Hockey skills will be supported by a hockey development officer. • Initial skill training and practice of individual events and team games for the Athletics carnival in Term 4.
Health	During Health this term, students will be engaging in: • Focusing on actions in our daily routines that promote health, safety and wellbeing. Topics will include personal hygiene, the importance of sleep, the benefits of staying physically active and safety during play.
Music	During Music this term, students will be engaged in: • Developing aural skills and musicianship through chants, songs, fingerplays and rhymes; games; movement and dance; and listening activities. • Developing their understanding of rhythmic notation.
LOTE - Noongar	During Noongar this term, students will be engaged in: • Exploring and identifying a variety of insects in the Noongar language. • Developing skills in using the correct word order in Noongar sentences. • Building on previously learned suffixes to form more complex sentences. • Learning new vocabulary to enhance everyday conversation in Noongar. • Discovering the uses of traditional Noongar plants from our Six Seasons Garden, including how they were used for food, medicine, and tools.
