English	<ul> <li>During Literacy this term, students will be engaging in:</li> <li>Using knowledge of letter sound relationships to spell common words accurately.</li> <li>Using phonics and word knowledge to fluently read more complex words, identify literal/implied meaning in texts, select information, ideas and events that connect with self and other texts.</li> <li>Correctly punctuate sentences, i.e. capital letters and full stop, use paragraphs, narratives/stories.</li> </ul>
Mathematics	<ul> <li>During Numeracy this term, students will be engaging in:</li> <li>Strategies to learn multiplication facts, such as the turn-around idea (i.e. 3x2 = 6, so 3x2 = 6 and 6 ÷3 = 2 and 6 ÷2 = 3).</li> <li>Using doubles, arrays, division, factors and multiples, subtraction – formal method, estimating.</li> <li>Using number patterns and discovering rules, odd and even numbers.</li> <li>Investigating the area of shapes,</li> <li>Recognising times in minutes, and hour and minute conversions, using timetables, i.e. bus timetables.</li> <li>Recognising angles – right, acute, obtuse, reflex and straight.</li> <li>Graphing.</li> </ul>
Visual Arts	<ul> <li>During Visual Arts this term, students will be engaging in:</li> <li>Exploring the enchanting world of "Under the Sea" as we delve into ocean-themed art. This theme has been specially selected in alignment with our school's exciting opportunity to showcase a selection of student artworks at the Albany Entertainment Centre for the upcoming Albany Children's Theatre production of The Little Mermaid.</li> <li>Designing detailed underwater themed scenes, layering textures, colours and forms using painted paper, collage and mixed materials.</li> <li>Exploring ideas and techniques in artworks inspiredby natural habitatsand marine life.</li> </ul>
Health	<ul> <li>During Health this term, students will be engaging in:</li> <li>Focusing on "ways in which health information can influence health decisions and behaviours" and "how the media can influence personal health choices."</li> <li>Moving onto - Personal identity and change- Physical, social and emotional changesthat occur as individuals grow older. Changes associated with puberty and strategies to manage these changes associated with puberty.</li> </ul>
Physical Education	<ul> <li>During Physical Education this term, students will be engaging in:</li> <li>The skipping continuum and learning the fundamental movement skill that involves rhythmic movement.</li> <li>Hockey skills will be supported by a hockey development officer.</li> <li>Initial skill training and practice of individual events and team games for the Athletics carnival in Term 4.</li> </ul>

Music	<ul> <li>During Music this term, students will be engaged in:</li> <li>exploring the elements of music and developing musicianship skills through songs from: <ul> <li>a variety of cultures;</li> <li>styles and eras;</li> <li>singing games;</li> <li>theory games;</li> <li>movement and dance;</li> <li>body percussion; and</li> </ul> </li> <li>oplaying classroom instruments (focusing on tuned percussion).</li> <li>Learning to identify instruments of the orchestra and instrument families.</li> </ul>
LOTE - Noongar	<ul> <li>During Noongar this term, students will be engaged in:</li> <li>Exploring and identifying a variety of insects in the Noongar language.</li> <li>Developing skills in using the correct word order in Noongar sentences.</li> <li>Building on previously learned suffixes to form more complex sentences.</li> <li>Learning new vocabulary to enhance everyday conversation in Noongar.</li> <li>Discovering the uses of traditional Noongar plants from our Six Seasons Garden, including how they were used for food, medicine, and tools.</li> </ul>
